

Lawn and Garden Tractor Pulls

Rules:

1. Each tractor must appear factory stock (except class D)
2. Only one driver may drive tractor in the same contest
3. Driver must be ten (10) years old or older to enter. Drivers ten (10) to sixteen (16) years old may only enter the pull with a parents consent provided they wear a helmet during the pull and must be able to operate the tractor on their own.
4. Each tractor will be allowed three (3) minutes or three (3) tries. Time starts when the tractor is hitched and a try consists of the bolt moving one (1) inch or more.
5. No implements, chains, cleats, tracks, etc.
6. Tractor must be weighed for each class including driver. Tires must be loaded. All Weight added must be securely attached to wheels or frame. All brackets are to be attached in a safe manner not to interfere with driver or hitching. No weight shall be on or in the way of the seat, clutch or brakes. If a weight or tractor part is lost while pulling, attempt will be counted as a try, but not measured.
7. Front weights must not exceed eighteen inches (18") forward of the front most position of the tractor including weights. (Class D should be 6.5' from the center of the rear Axel to the forward most position including weights.)
8. Chain must be hooked off of a safe draw bar using a clevis or ring able to accept a 3/8 slip hook loosely and should not exceed a height of nine inches (9") for all classes. Hitches will be measured to the pulling point on the clevis where the hook sits. For clevises and rings that drop down, hitch will be measured at the center of pinning spot of ring or clevis.
9. Tractor must have wheelie bar or bars able to support tractor in class it is entered and must prevent the front axel from lifting more than fourteen inches (14") or the tractor will be disqualified.
10. Open class of 1800 pounds and under must have an unmodified factory frame (not including rear axle) no longer than 6.5 feet from the center of the rear axle to the farthest most point including the weights. The tractor must not have more than four (4) cylinders combined and must have four (4) wheels. 4-wheel drive must be disengaged if present. Must have wheelie bars able to support tractor and follow all other safety rules. Pull officials will inspect tractors for safety. Authorization to pull will be made by pull officials.
11. Driver must stay in seat of tractor at all times. No bouncing or rocking will be allowed. First offense is a warning and a second offense will be disqualification.
12. No locked or locking rear axles. 4-wheel drive must be disconnected (except Class D).
13. A full pull of six feet (6') should be done in one pull of a continuous movement. If the boat stops for more than 3 seconds, it will be counted as a try.
14. The bolt must be set back if it is pulled more than twelve inches (12"). The driver can request the bolt be pulled back at any time.
15. All tires must remain on the slab the entire time. If the point of the tire that touches the slab goes off of the edge of the slab, it will be counted as a try but not measured.
16. The top three tractor are subject to being reweighed.
17. A copy of these rules will be available at the pulling area.

18. All decisions are final and will be made by the superintendent or pull official. Slight modifications of the rules may be made by the superintendent or pull officials at any time in the event of a conflict and/or location or pad conditions. There are no exceptions to this rule.

Classes:

- A. 900 pounds and under
- B. 1200 pounds and under
- C. 1500 pounds and under
- D. 1800 pounds modified

Prizes:
